Turmoil in IVORY COAST

Like all Ivorians, Auguste and Brigitte were fearful for their lives as they struggled to survive. During the war, their house became a haven for their two sets of parents, uncles, aunts, nephews, brothers and friends: a total of 30-36 people living in their very small home from February until May. They often travelled 20 or even 30 km on foot in search of food in the outlying villages. Their parents came from the neighbourhood of Abobo, the suburb where Hassane and his wife lived, where fighting was centred and killings and pillaging were taking place daily.

As was announced by foreign radio stations, the suburb where Auguste and Brigitte live, was the stronghold of the ousted president Gbagbo and fighting took place all around them. From their house they heard the blast of rocket launchers, Kalashnikovs and other weapons, but by God's grace and power, they were not hit.

Hassane and Josiane had their house totally ransacked. Their place served as the SOWERS office so all of the supplies were kept there. Big bins of powdered paint were tipped over the floor and taps turned on so the house was flooded and everything spoilt. All their furniture, clothing and household items were either stolen or destroyed. Hassane

could only salvage 100 Level 1 & 2 manuals so there is a need for them and the counselling tracts to be reprinted.

The security situation is not under complete control by the new authorities. That means there is a threat of further attacks by the nearly 14,000 police officers and soldiers who did not return to their bases and who are now hiding in the forest. All of our other Sowers were traumatised





Change was effected as the Sextons returned to Uganda to advance the work further and as Emmanuel travelled from Zambia to Kenya to consider how best he could relaunch the work there. We want to acknowledge the life and contribution of Rev. Dr. Richard Foli of Ghana, who passed away in May after a short illness. He served on the SI Ghana Board since its inception 34 years ago.

We Choose to Die

We think of a 500 km journey in terms of hours, not days, so it is hard for us in the West to understand the sacrifice and hardship many of our evangelists endure as they carry the Gospel to those who still haven't heard the Good News of Jesus. This was the experience of K. Emmanuel, as he travelled to the north of his province of Katanga, in DR Congo.

During this visit, two local churches were planted in Pygmy villages - a people group neglected and nonevangelized. He says, "The work is hard and the sacrifices are great, but realising that Christ died for all, we also choose to die in thankfulness to Him, leaving our lives, our property and our plans, for the love of Christ compels us." 2 Cor 4:14

While on this visit, he also opened a pastoral school and a Christian

library. In one remote area he found several pastors sharing a ragged, incomplete copy of the *Bible*, as they are too poor to each have their own copy.

Back in Lubumbashi, Emmanuel and Saidi along with Stephen and Puta from Zambia have trained 19 people up to Levels 2, 3 & 4 in the SOWERS program, meaning that even more people will be able to hear the Good News.
